The English Indices of Deprivation 2015 – ‘Education, Skills and Training Deprivation’ Domain

Last updated: October 2015

Introduction

The Education, Skills and Training Deprivation Domain measures the lack of attainment and skills in the local population. The indicators fall into two sub-domains: one relating to children and young people and one relating to adult skills.

At the opposite end of the scale, there are no Island LSOAs within the 20% least deprived areas in England.

Indicators

The indicators used to calculate Education, Skills and Training Deprivation include:

- Key Stage 2 attainment
- Key Stage 4 attainment
- Secondary school absence
- Staying on in education post-16
- Entry to higher education
- Adult skills
- English language proficiency
