Section 4

Communal establishments



The census counted everyone present in a variety of communal establishments in addition to those living in households.

A communal establishment is defined as an establishment providing managed residential accommodation. Managed means full-time or part-time supervision of the accommodation.

Communal establishments

There are a wide variety of communal establishments on the island, but the most common category is 'hotel or boarding/guest houses', followed closely by 'private residential care homes'.

Due to most communal establishments on the Island being hotels or guesthouses, it is not really a surprise that the distribution map shows a distinct concentration in The Bay area. There are also smaller concentrations in Ryde and West Wight.

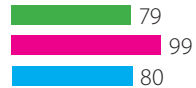

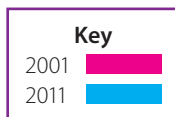

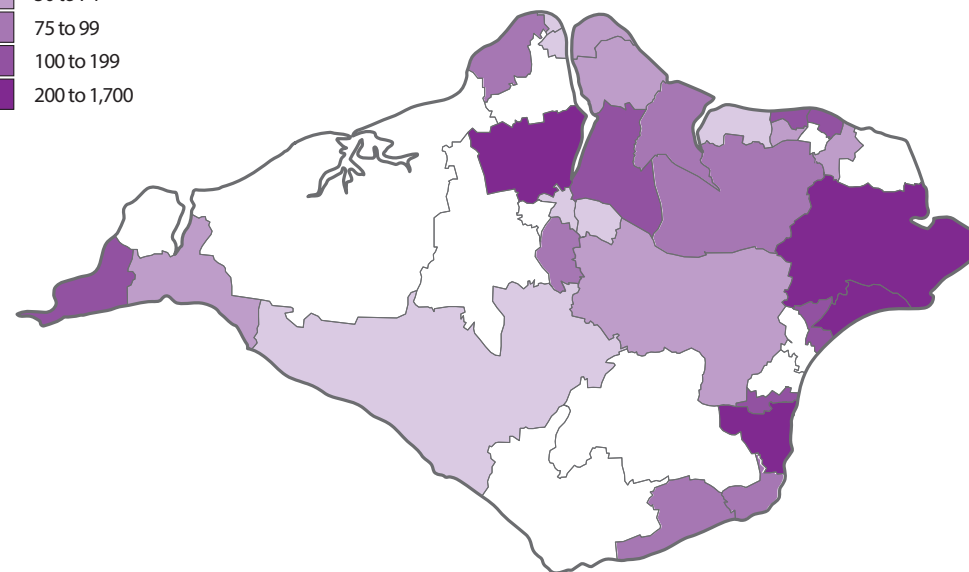
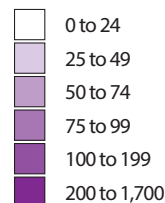
All people in communal establishments

The distribution of people in communal establishments shows a much wider spread, reflecting the existence of large establishments of this kind in many other parts of the Island. Once again, Parkhurst ward stands out because of the substantial number of people 'resident' in the three prisons and the hospital.
